Selamta brings hope and healing to orphaned and abandoned children by recreating and empowering families.

VISION

Children growing up knowing their God-given dignity and worth through the love of a healthy family.

CORE COMPETENCIES



WRAP-AROUND CARE

For the last fifteen years, Selamta has been building up and refining wrap-around care for our families. There are four cornerstones we build on:



This holistic approach takes into consideration all aspects of an individual: mind, body, and spirit. We are interconnected. Our beings, like our families, are made up of many parts that come together, creating extraordinary possibilities. Wrapping around each individual and family provides the structure and support necessary to grow and negotiate needs. Advocacy, empowerment, and encouragement are central to Selamta's wrap-around care.

We look through every situation with a trauma-informed lens, knowing there is always a need behind the behavior. A balance of structure and nurture are necessary for healing and learning to take place. From there, extraordinary opportunities exist for our children and families.



COMMUNITY INTEGRATION

We were created to live in community. Every community has resources and specialists with expertise specific to that geographic area and culture. Too often, children who have been orphaned or abandoned are placed in institutions, away from the general public, with little access to the world around them. How is a person supposed to function successfully in society when they haven't grown up in that world? It's simple, they can't. This is why Selamta is dedicated to leveraging the systems and resources of our local communities to meet the needs of our families. Whether it's local schools, churches, community programs, or medical resources, we work with local experts to find the right resources for our families. If the right resources aren't available, we reach out beyond those geographical boundaries to get what's needed.

PERMANENCY

Felt-safety is more than the intellectual knowledge of being safe from harm, it's a feeling of security. It's knowing you belong. It's knowing you can trust and rely on the people and place you come home to at the end of the day. In Selamta's Forever Family Program, family is more than the years of childhood, it's forever. There is no end date for Selamta's wrap-around support either. A family's ability to access the network of professional support provided through Selamta's Community Center is also forever. Life is a journey with ups and downs. Selamta is committed to being available to the families we serve throughout their lifespan.



VISION FORWARD

As our leadership team updated our mission, vision, and core competencies, we had to be intentional about strategic planning. Since 2006, we have witnessed the effectiveness of our Forever Family model. We knew we needed to repeat it, which we did in 2019 and 2020. We are dedicated to growing our Forever Family Program for as long as it's necessary in Ethiopia. At the same time, we recognize that the wrap-around care we give our Forever Families is the same kind of support separated biological families, kinship care families, foster families, and adoptive families need to thrive. This is why we believe the Selamta Community Center - which has been a beacon of light and hope in our Alem Bank community for over a decade - needs to be replicated in another neighborhood in the greater Addis Ababa area.

But that's just the beginning...

For years, people have asked whether Selamta could work in the United States. While we don't believe our Forever Family program is necessary due to the US systems of foster care and domestic adoption, we have learned that our Community Center programs may have practical applications that could significantly benefit children and families. With wrap-around care, community integration, and permanency, we believe it's possible to increase the rate of reunification of separated children back to their parents, reduce the rate of children returning to foster care, and increase the number of foster families ready and willing to meet the specialized needs of children. So could Selamta work in the US? We're exploring all the possibilities now and we'll keep you posted!

COMMUNITY CENTER

This is where family and community come together. This is where children are seen, heard, and valued. This is where parents learn skills they didn't get growing up. This is where family, dignity, and hope thrive.

FOREVER FAMILY

We unite 8-10 children into a healthy family structure with a Selamta-trained mother in their own home, integrated into their local community.

Children grow up together as a family over a 10-20 year period before launching from Selamta's care into independence.

Our professional staff serve each family with an emphasis on Education, Health & Wellness, Psychosocial Support, and Spiritual Development.

Growing up in a stable family, surrounded by the love of Christ, gives children a strong sense of belonging.





Mulu was the very first child to come into Selamta in 2006. She grew up in Haile Selassie House for almost 15 years with 9 brothers and sisters. Mulu completed her studies and went on to earn her bachelor's degree in management from Hope University before starting her career as a human resources professional for the Addis Ababa-Djibouti Railway. Earlier this year, her Selamta family had the honor to serve as her elders when her now husband sent his elders to ask for her hand in marriage.

"Family is family. Now I am launched but I am always with them in my thoughts. I don't have any words to express my love for my family members. They are so special. I started my own personal life but every weekend and at holiday time I visit them. My mom is a great mother; I always miss her and call her every single day." Mulu, Launched Selamta Youth

18 NEW KIDS

Selamta is committed to bringing children out of institutions and into families. In August, 18 children joined our Selamta Family and moved into the Selamta Kids' Center. These children come from a variety of backgrounds, many of whom were living far too long in government institutions. They are now part of a large, extended family. Over the coming months, two new family homes will form and these children will experience the power of family, dignity, and hope.



"I feel really good that Selamta is bringing in new kids. Because other kids as well are having the opportunity to grow up in Selamta's care." WRAP-AROUND CARE -4 CORNERSTONES

Two and a half year old Liya* came to Selamta's Community Center from the government orphanage with her slightly older brother to be reunified with their two older sisters. They hadn't seen each other in several months after local authorities discovered they were living alone in a single room. Liya wasn't speaking. She wasn't walking unassisted. She had yet to achieve many developmental milestones typical of a child her age. She had experienced more trauma and loss in her brief life than many experience in a lifetime. But there was a light in her eyes and a smile on her face that cut through the darkness. There was little documented medical information to understand Liya's developmental history. The siblings became part of a new Selamta Forever Family.

Trust and felt-safety would be essential for Selamta's team to effectively help these children heal; but these are not built overnight. They take time, consistency, patience, and connection for real relationships to develop. Liya's oldest sister was fiercely protective and their Selamta Mom had to carefully negotiate how to help her release the responsibility of being a caregiver and embrace the idea of being a kid again.

To address her developmental issues, Liya was taken to several pediatricians, a pediatric neurologist, and therapists. A child who experiences early complex trauma can show symptoms and behaviors mirroring those of various developmental or mental disorders, making it difficult to receive concrete answers. Liya started speech and occupational therapy with a specialized doctor. This level of care is not commonly available in Ethiopia.



After 6 months of treatment, Liya was running, jumping, using her words, and learning to negotiate her needs without a meltdown. At a follow-up appointment, Liya's pediatric neurologist was blown away by her progress.

"Meredith, one of our volunteers who visited us in July, is a speech pathologist and helped us much in supporting Liya to obey directions, negotiate her needs, and be able to accept 'No'. Now Liya is about to register for school for the coming academic year. She will be engaged in school, our sweet youngest kid, Liya." Megdelawit, Social Worker

Consistent prayers have been prayed around the world for the healing of these children physically, mentally, and emotionally. Realizing that Liya will start Kindergarten (KG1) this fall, like her other Selamta brothers and sisters, is a massive answer to prayer. Liya is growing and thriving because she is seen, heard, and valued by consistent and connected caregivers.

EDUCATION 🗃

After being out of school for eight months, getting back in the classroom couldn't come soon enough. Starting in January 2020, our students went back to school. The school week was abbreviated to start, but they took advantage of every opportunity to learn. The virtual programs developed through 2020 continued throughout 2021 and combined with specialized tutoring to meet the needs of each student. Although our 2020 high school graduates couldn't start university on time, we're so proud of their commitment and look forward to the class of 2021 starting their university studies soon.


